SUMMARY

Description, critical edition and interpretation of medieval charters with the help of new technologies in a digital environment.

OBJECTIVES

This course had the following objectives: to let students in the Master of archivists experience the potential value of Diplomatics in their current training and future profession. To this end a blended course was offered that converged in a task of describing and editing medieval charters in Monasterium.Net as part of a European project (ENArC: EU-funded Culture Programme 2007-2013). The named course is on rete@ccessibile, a moodle platform (www.firbreteaccessibile.it).

Related purposes are: direct access to the charters always within the original or current archival stock, training to the reading of charters and the interpretation of their diplomatic forms, approach to methods, both traditional and digital, description and editing of medieval documents.

METHODOLOGY

In a first phase were presented in a series of lectures basic issues in the history of documents in the Middle Ages, with particular reference to documentation produced and stored in archives of Southern Italy, in the context of the most trusted online resources available for the use of medieval documents and existing digital technologies, such as the XML markup language.

At a later stage first a group- and than an individual activity was carried out in the computer lab, through which, according to the principle of 'learning by doing', students carried out practical experiences on medieval charters created with EditMOM software. These experiments were primarily aimed at assessing the textual tradition (original, copy, forgery etc.), the diplomatic analysis of the forms, the redaction of abstracts and transcription and the acquisition of the methodology of edition.
