Within last year the following activities had been carried out:

Archivio Storico Diocesano Reggio Calabria-Bova (1495-1963)

The last parish registers of the diocese of St. Pölten were digitized. The registers of 404 parishes are now available on the website. In the Archdiocese of Vienna, the last parish registers of the "Weinviertel" will be online with the end of June 2013 and will thus include 266 parishes. In January 2013 the digitizing of the parish registers of the city of Vienna began. At the end of May 2013 the parish registers of six parishes were online.

The number of monthly users is furthermore stable at approx. 50.000 per month.

4. EU-funded projects

a) "EUROPEAN NETWORK ON ARCHIVAL COOPERATION" (ENArC) (Culture Programme 2007 - 2013)

The first interim report to the European Commission in May 2012 was successfully evaluated and accepted. The second pre-financing payment was followed shortly after.

Due to administrative reasons – especially to get a better overview over the costs incurred by each one of the 14 project partners – a further financial interim report covering the period from March to December 2012 for internal purposes was agreed. All participating institutions had been invited to send their documentation material (i.e. invoices, timesheets, payrolls, contracts etc.) in time so that it could be analyzed till the upcoming ENArC-Meeting in Dublin in June 2013.

The next official financial and progress report to the EU will be due in September 2013 summarizing the activities and expenses from March 2012 to August 2013. With its approval the third pre-financing payment from the EU is to be expected – provided that 70% of the last payment had been spent.

b) "MEN AND BOOKS – for a risk-free use of the European written cultural heritage" (Culture Programme 2007-2013)

Background: Book and paper conservators and archivists all over Europe have a big common unsolved problem: mould. Mould destroys our cultural heritage. Especially books and charters in archives, being unique by nature and thus extremely valuable for our understanding of Europe's past are very much at risk to be lost due to microorganisms: Firstly because there are fungi, that particularly attack and destroy paper and parchment; secondly because archival material is stored en masse and is comparatively rarely moved – therefore infestation often stays undiscovered for a long time until it is so vast, that it cannot be overseen. Mouldy material is a serious health hazard for men, both archivists and readers, as most of the spores cause dangerous illnesses. Today still many charters and books are disinfected with toxic measures.

The project wants to find a solution to exterminate mould with a substance and method harmless for men and books. This is beneficial for all European users of archival material. The Archives of the Protestant Parish of the Holy Trinity in Swidnica (PL) houses about 12000 manuscripts, prints, bound books and loose archival material. This archival material is complete without any losses from 1652 until today. These highly valuable sources for the history of Protestantism were chosen as a representative material. The material is certainly of interest for all European citizens which are interested in their history.

From the material point the various writing materials, leathers, parchment and paper in this archive are found in almost any historic collection in Europe, promising significant results useful for any other institution in Europe and around the world.

In total this project cannot be realized without a substantial interdisciplinary, international dialogue. By combining art and culture, history and science and health- topics the project clearly is more than its parts.

The first event in the project was a kick-off-meeting of all project partners in Horn/AT, from 9th - 10th May 2012, introducing all partners and their roles in the project, sharing information on administrative and financial issues and planning the next steps.

The second project meeting took place at the Charles University in Prague on 01 May 2013. The main aim of the conference was to present the findings of recent research on Silesian Protestantism and preservation of its cultural heritage and discuss these with the Czech and international academic public. c) APEx project (ICT-PSP)

As of March 1st, 2012 ICARUS is partner in the Archives Portal Europe network of excellence - APEx – project. It is an European-based Best Practice Network project aiming at expanding, enriching, enhancing and sustaining the Archives Portal Europe. APEx is the joint effort of the already participating European archives and those archival institutions yet to become partners which are expanding the Archives Portal Europe and gets the archival landscape in shape for the quickly advancing digital future of our society.

APEx – the Archives Portal Europe network of excellence – is the framework for European archives to collaborate for wider and enhanced accessibility of their content on the web. It continues the work of the APEnet project (2009–2012) in which 19 European national archives and Europeana established and released the Archives Portal Europe. With the continued expansion and enhancement of the Archives Portal Europe – in terms of participating countries and institutions, plus available content and services – APEx will contribute to the development of a coherent digital infrastructure which opens up the portal to our common cultural heritage of archives, equally accessible for citizens, researchers, businesses and governments alike.

Funded and supported by the European Commission within the framework of the Information and Technology Policy Support Programme (ICT-PSP), APEx runs from March 2012 until February 2015.

ICARUS is actively contributing to the Work Package 5 – Tools & Support, WP 6 – Usability & Web 2.0 and WP 7 – Dissemination & Training.

d) "Memory without borders" (CrArc) (Interreg IVA: Creating the future – Slovakia-Austria 2007-2013)

The first and second period of the 2,5 year long ETC project were successfully implemented two interim-reports were submitted to the financial control in October 2012 and February 2013. The reports listed all related activities and expenses of the project partners. The first report has already been accepted. ICARUS acts as Lead partner and coordinates all activities of the Austrian and Slovak project partners.

Carrying on the work started in a similar cross-border project in 2008-2010, BASNet now continues the digitization and research on archival content concerning the common historic background of the border region of Upper Austria, Salzburg and Bavaria. Additionally the set up of a digitally available database of important persons among other tools will support the historic research in the named area. ICARUS acts as consultant on administrative issues. The first project period was successfully implemented and the first interim-report of activities and expenses was submitted to the financial control in January 2013.

5. Further activities

World War I - project

As unfortunately the ENWWI project application recently missed to be funded in the Culture-programme, ICARUS started to think about alternative ways to reach at least partially the goals of the project. A quite big group of supporting institutions and persons, who believe that it is still possible to reach remarkable results even without EU-funding are just about to build up the necessary organisational structures.

The ICARUS Didactics Work Group

The Didactics work group is one of the cited teams. It was established during an ICARUS meeting in Poznan (Poland) in June 2011. It currently consists of 37 members (researchers and professors of Archival Sciences, Palaeography, Diplomatics and Medieval History) from 15 European countries (Austria, Bulgaria, Croatia, Finland, France, Germany, Italy, Malta, Poland, Portugal, Czech Republic, Serbia, Slovakia, Spain, Hungary) and 3 tutors. Several participants of the Didactics group work specifically on theory and methodology of teaching with digital technologies. The ground seemed fertile to constitute a team of European scholars, tutors and archivists and build a solid digital learning environment involving as many partners as possible.

The Didactics group has been focused on a variety of goals:

- Training university students and graduates by teaching Diplomatics, Paleography and Medieval History using digital technologies as Monasterium. Net portal and MOM-CA software.
- Encouraging the physical mobility of students and teachers throughout Europe in order to foster a profitable exchange of experiences and skills.
- Giving graduates who work in the archival field theoretical and practical gears to create and manage digital archives in Monasterium.Net.
- Carrying out detailed didactic projects involving as many ICARUS members as possible as well as people and/or institutions outside ICARUS.

The University of Naples Federico II (UNINA) coordinates the educational activities of the ICARUS Didactics Group in the person of Antonella Ambrosio, lecturer at the department of Humanities and teacher in Palaeography and Diplomatics.

ACHIEVEMENTS

• International e-learning course in Palaeography, History and Diplomatics

The first interesting and ambitious project of the ICARUS Didactics Group is the setting up of an international e-learning course in Diplomatics.

The course is still at the planning stage but it will be developed in the framework of Monasterium.Net.

During the workshop in Einsiedeln 2012 (within the Icarus meeting) the following speakers presented several didactic units proposals for the international e-learning course:
