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From its very beginning WWI has been considered the final decline of an old world and the beginning of a new one (e.g. the era of world wars and totalitarianism). The "Great War" had different, but anyhow traumatic impact in all countries, therefore to deal with its histories and memories, means to afford the birth of modern world.

This series of lectures is part of the "Edu-ENArC" didactic activities organized by SNS inside of the European Project ENArC - European Network for Archival Cooperation (Culture Program 2007-13) which aims at sharing and disseminate competences and best practices in the archival field on an international level, as well as the knowledge of IT-instruments for archival management and research. The lectures will take place once a month trying to involve the most important European countries which took part to WWI.
